



A. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report provides information for the Board regarding the renewal of the Toronto Catholic District School Board (TCDSB) Education Development Charges By-law.

On June 29, 2018, the Board adopted EDC By-law No. 190, an interim By-law with a one-year term, which expires on July 3, 2019. The current By-law in place maintains the 2015 amendment rates of \$1,493 per residential unit and \$1.07 per square foot of non-residential gross floor area respectively.

As a result of the Ministry of Education solely permitting the adoption of a one-year EDC By-law at the rates previously in place, the TCDSB faces a significant shortfall to address upcoming committed site acquisitions, and is unable to access external financing for these purposes.

The TCDSB must proceed with adopting a new five year EDC By-law to address these issues. A schedule for the adoption of the By-law is included in the body of this report.

The cumulative staff time required to prepare this report was 2 hours

B. BACKGROUND

- 1. On June 29, 2018, the Toronto Catholic District School Board (TCDSB) adopted Education Development Charges By-law (EDC) No. 190, which put in place an interim by-law with a one-year term, which expires on July 3, 2019.
- 2. The interim By-law was adopted as a result of the Ministry of Education solely permitting the adoption of a one-year EDC By-law at the rates in place prior to June 30, 2018: \$1,493 per residential unit and \$1.07 per square foot of non-residential gross floor area respectively.
- 3. The Ministry's requirement to adopt a one-year interim EDC By-law has placed the TCDSB in a significant financial shortfall to address upcoming site purchases, and has impeded the Board's ability to access external financing to meet its commitments.

- 4. As per the September 13, 2018, Board resolution, the TCDSB is beginning the process replacing the interim EDC By-law with a new five-year By-law, as per the schedule outlined below:
 - October 2, 2018: Notice and Re-circulation of Background Study, as well as posting on Board website. TCDSB staff will meet with development community stakeholders and respond to any inquiries as requested.
 - October 11, 2018: Public Meeting #1 Policy Review Public Meeting.
 - October 18, 2018: Public Meeting #2 First Successor By-law Public Meeting
 - Presentation of EDC Background Study approach and recommendations, as well as EDC By-law;
 - O Proposed EDC rates for Board consideration;
 - O Comparison of other EDC rates and total EDC rates; and
 - Inviting stakeholder input
 - **November 15, 2018:** Public Meeting #3 EDC By-law Adoption Public Meeting
 - Board staff to present recommendations regarding policy decisions and proposed EDC rates;
 - O Trustees to consider adoption of the By-law, following invitation for stakeholder input; and
 - O Provide City of Toronto Building/Finance staff with updated EDC rates.
- 5. The new EDC By-law, subject to appeals, will be in effect on December 3, 2018.

C. CONCLUDING STATEMENT
