



LEADER: Would the Trustees please stand.

LEADER: Will you now renew your personal commitment to strive to live

according to the Gospel of Jesus Christ and to live this Gospel in union with your brothers and sisters in the community of the

TRUSTEES: With the help of God's grace and the support of each other, we

renew our commitment.

LEADER: Will you respect and honour the confidence placed in you by parents

through a conscientious effort to promote Christian values in the Catholic schools of the Toronto Catholic District School Board?

TRUSTEES: I will.

LEADER: Will you show leadership in helping the children of our schools

come to knowledge of the love of God in their lives?

TRUSTEES: I will.

ELECTIONS BY-LAWS

Section 3.12 of the TCDSB General Working By-Law 175 (2016) outlines the following rules for elections:

3.12 Elections

The election of Trustees and others to positions required to be filled by the Board of Trustees shall be conducted by the Presiding Officer as follows:

- 3.12.1 nominations shall be sought, each of which shall be moved and seconded;
- 3.12.2 after the nominations for the position have been closed and before the vote is taken, each candidate who has not already so declared and in the sequence nominated, shall declare whether or not such candidate will serve;
- 3.12.3 if there are two or more nominations for any position, the election shall be conducted by secret ballot, provided that, with the agreement of majority of Trustees, a recorded vote may be used pursuant to which the identity of both the Trustee voting and the name of the candidate are recorded and announced;
- 3.12.4 with the approval of the Board of Trustees, two returning officers shall be appointed, the duties of whom shall include the distribution and counting of the ballots; and
- 3.12.5 after each ballot has been counted in any round of balloting, the name of every candidate receiving no votes, and the name of the candidate otherwise receiving the lowest number of votes shall be dropped, and the balloting shall so continue until a candidate has received a majority of the votes of the Trustees present;
- 3.12.6 at any time that there are three or more names remaining on a ballot and two or more nominees are tied with the least number of votes, a vote shall be taken to decide which of such tied nominees shall remain on the list of names to be voted upon in the next round of voting; and
- 3.12.7 In the case of an equality of votes between two, or among three or more, candidates for any office or position, during three consecutive ballots, the candidates shall draw lots to fill the office or position.

PROCEDURES FOR CAUCUS MEETING

The directions below follow the numbering of the Caucus Agenda.

- 1. The Secretary of the Board (Director of Education) calls the meeting to order, welcomes the Trustees, and identifies himself as the Chair of the meeting for the evening until the Chair of the Board is elected.
- 2. The Associate Directors reads the memorials, if any.
- 3. Fr. Lehman is invited to open the meeting with a prayer, and leads the Trustees through the Rite of Renewal.
- 4. The Director then reads the roll call and indicates apologies, if any.
- 5. The Director calls for a motion to approve the Agenda, as presented. The Agenda may be amended to add urgent business from the Director, or to add urgent miscellaneous matters or inquiries from Trustees.
- 5a. The first matter the Board has to consider is the method of voting for Chair and Vice-Chair of the Board, and of the Statutory and Standing Committees. You will notice that according to **By-Laws Article 3.12.3 (p.2)**, which is included in the Agenda, the election shall be conducted by secret ballot, provided that, with the agreement of the majority of Trustees, a recorded vote may be used pursuant to which the identity of both the Trustee voting and the name of the candidate, are recorded and announced. The Director of Education will now ask the Trustees which manner of voting they prefer. All those in favour of a secret ballot, please vote now.
 - With the approval of the Board of Trustees, two (2) returning officers shall be appointed, one of whom will be the Board's Assistant Recording Secretary, and the other being the Associate Director, Academic Affairs, to act as Scrutineers.

6a. Election of Chair of the Board for 2020-2021:

Now that the ground rules and the manner of voting have been determined, we will proceed with the election of the <u>Chair of the Board</u>.

- The Presiding Officer calls for nominations for the office of Chair of the Board, which must be seconded.
- After each nomination has been made, and seconded, the Presiding Officer will ask the nominee if he/she is willing to let their name stand in nomination.
- After nominations are closed, the Presiding Officer will invite or allow the nominated Trustee to say a few words in support of his/her candidacy.
- The Presiding Officer instructs the Scrutineers to distribute the ballots, and the vote will commence.
- The Scrutineers tabulate the results, and hand a written record of the results to the Director of Education, who reads out the results.

6b. Election of Vice-Chair of the Board for 2020-2021:

For the election of the <u>Vice-Chair of the Board</u>, the same process is used here as was used for the election of the Chair of the Board. (refer to 6a).

7. Appointments to Statutory Committees for 2020-2021:

The next order of business is the appointment to <u>Statutory Committees</u>. This process can be done by a vote, or it can be done by consensus. The Presiding Officer will move through the Agenda asking for Trustees to be nominated. If there are more Trustees nominated than there are positions available, then the election process will proceed the same way as was used for the Chair and the Vice-Chair of the Board (refer to 6a and 6b). This process for appointments to Statutory Committees has traditionally been done by consensus, without the need of a vote.

8. Election of Standing Committee Chairs for 2020-2021:

The election for the Chairs of these three Standing Committees will proceed in the same way as the election for the Chair and Vice-Chair of the Board (refer to 6a and 6b).

- a. Corporate Services, Strategic Planning, and Property Committee (All Trustees)
- b. Governance and Policy Committee (4 Trustees, 2 Ex-Officios)
- c. Student Achievement and Well Being, Catholic Education, and Human Resources Committee (All Trustees)

9. Election of Standing Committee Vice-Chairs for 2020-2021:

The election for the Vice-Chairs of these three Standing Committees will proceed in the same way as the election for the Chair and Vice-Chair of the Board (refer to 6a and 6b).

- a. Corporate Services, Strategic Planning, and Property Committee (All Trustees)
- b. Governance and Policy Committee (4 Trustees, 2 Ex-Officios)
- c. Student Achievement and Well Being, Catholic Education, and Human Resources Committee (All Trustees)

10. Reconstitution and Constitution of Ad-Hoc Committees for 2020-2021:

The next matter of business is the reconstitution of the Ad-Hoc Committees.

- a. By-Laws Review Committee (5 Trustees):
 - The Presiding Officer needs a motion to approve the reconstitution of the By-Laws Review Committee.
 - There needs to be a motion to determine the membership of this Committee.

- b. Director's Performance Appraisal Committee (4 Trustees):
 - The membership of this Committee is the Chair and the Vice-Chair, and the Chairs of the Standing Committees, and one Trustee member. No further election is required to establish the membership of this Committee.
- c. Executive Compensation Committee (4 Trustees):
 - The membership of this Committee is the Director of Education, Executive Superintendent of Human Resources and 4 Trustees.
- d. Labour Relations Committee (3 Trustees)
 - The membership of this Committee is the Director of Education,
 Executive Superintendent of Human Resources, Senior Legal Counsel-Employee Relations, and 3 Trustees.
- e. Political Action Advisory Committee (4 Trustees)
 - o The membership of this Committee is the Director of Education, Chief of Communications and Government Relations, and 4 Trustees.

11. Appointments or Re-Appointments to External/Internal Committees for 2020-2021:

These Committees are listed on the Agenda as Items 11)a - 11g; and 13a) - 13m). Typically, this is done by consensus, but in the event that more Trustees wish to serve than there are spaces available, an election will be held. Traditionally this is done by consensus by the Board.

The Angel Foundation for Learning (AFL) was founded in April 1987 to assist TCDSB in providing services to students in the TCDSB school community. As the official charity of the TCDSB, the Foundation supports academic achievement, by empowering students to focus on their education. The AFL meets students' needs through four wings of support:

- 1. **Student Nutrition Programs** As of September 2020, the AFL provides over \$6.5 million in funding to 167 TCDSB school sites running 184 student nutrition programs providing breakfast, a morning meal and/or lunch to some 60,000 students daily, serving over 1-million meals a month (approx. 10-million each academic year). Municipal and Provincial grants cover 24% of the cost of running these programs.
- 2. **School Allocation Funds** Each school can apply for up to \$500 to offset the cost of school trips for students that cannot afford to participate.
- 3. **Guardian Angel Funds** The AFL distributes over \$160,000 through seven funds: Social Work Emergency Fund; AFL Family Support Fund; Reliable Life Fund; AFL Camp Fund; Loblaw "Kids See Free" Fund; The Loretto Fund; and the AFL Arts Fund
- 4. **Bursaries & Awards** The AFL distributes four awards to elementary schools and eight bursaries for Secondary students.

Many of the AFL programs are sponsored through grants and donations. The AFL fundraising activities cover the costs of the School Allocation Funds, the Social Work Emergency Fund and the AFL Camp Fund.

The CNEA is both a 142-year-old organization and a modern showcase of agriculture, community, the arts and industry. In addition to hosting Canada's largest annual event, the CNEA has the following strategic goals:

- 1) to be an engaged year-round community partner (by expanding its involvement and presence within the community through the production of new events outside of the 18-day fair and development of initiatives that contribute to community building);
- 2) preserve and promote the rich CNEA heritage;
- 3) participate in discussions concerning the site's future;
- 4) modernize CNEA governance in support of the CNEA's mission and vision; and
- 5) champion organizational excellence.

The CNEA is responsible for the planning and presentation of the annual Canadian National Exhibition at Exhibition Place in Toronto, Ontario. Founded in 1879, the CNE is an 18-day fair that takes place in late summer leading up to, and including, Labour Day. The Canadian National Exhibition is Canada's largest annual event and averages 1.5M in attendance.

The CNE is taking on new events and opportunities such as the 'CNE Presents the Aurora Winter Festival'. During the end of summer event, the CNE and their partners employ 5,000 people, over 1,000 of whom are youth. The CNE's annual economic impact on the Greater Toronto Area is \$93M (as of 2017).

Composition:

The CNEA is composed of up to 159 member appointees, both individuals appointed from the community-at-large and appointees from a variety of organizations who are members of the association. Staff manage all event operations and day-to-day matters and the CNEA is governed by an oversight volunteer Board of Directors and Committees.

Traditionally each year, a Board of Directors is elected from this membership giving equal representation to each of the Manufacturers & Industry, Agriculture, and General & Liberal Arts sections of the association membership. Due to the delay of the 2020 Annual Meeting as

a result of COVID-19, the Membership will consider an extension of the current Board until the new term in the Spring of 2021. Six representatives for the Municipal section are appointed by Toronto City Council to the CNEA Board.

Time commitment:

Includes attendance at the Annual Meeting(s), currently one meeting per year, traditionally in the spring, visiting the fair over the 18 days and reporting out / communications back to the TCDSB about relevant CNE activities.

The TCDSB representative (appointee) attends Annual Meeting(s), votes in the CNEA Board elections, explores opportunities for programming partnerships, has optional participation in CNEA Committees/Task Forces and receives credentials to the Annual CNE fair. Time commitment increases if the TCDSB appointee participates in a CNEA Committee or is involved in any CNE-TCDSB joint programming.
