It recognizes exceptional and innovative work being done in schools to create a safe and thriving environment for learning and creativity.

CSLIT's **Directors of Elementary Affairs**, hosted their last E-CSLIT meeting of 2015 on December 7th, which was located at the Catholic Education Centre. In preparation for the event, they were thankful to have TCDSB graduate Dr. Sylvia Marcos speak about her organization, Socks4Souls. The Equity Subcommittee has been diligently working on a great deal of new initiatives over the course of their past few meetings.
