- 2. School Allocation Funds Each school can apply for up to \$500 to offset the cost of school trips for students that cannot afford to participate.
- 3. Guardian Angel Funds The AFL distributes \$140,000 through seven funds: Social Work Emergency Fund; AFL Family Support Fund; Reliable Life Fund; AFL Camp Fund; Loblaw "Kids See Free" Fund; The Loretto Fund; and the AFL Arts Fund
- 4. Bursaries & Awards The AFL distributes four awards to elementary schools and eight bursaries for Secondary students.

Many of the AFL programs are sponsored through grants and donations. The AFL fundraising activities cover the costs of the School Allocation Funds, the Social Work Emergency Fund and the AFL Camp Fund.
