

Objectives


- 1. To expand access by 25% to short-term and secure long-term public bicycle parking in Toronto.
- 2. To provide sufficient, relevant and safe bicycle parking in an equitable manner.
- 3. To partner with internal and external stakeholders in the provision of expanded bicycle parking.
- 4. To provide a **framework** and **method** for the **ongoing provision** and **maintenance** of bicycle parking.

Example School Projects

- 300 multi-bike(8 bikes) racks to be donated to TDSB upon council approval (2015)
- 1 Bicycle Shelter with racks for 16 bicycles for Artscape Youngplace & Givins-Shaw Junior Public School (2013)
- 1 multi-bike (8 bikes) rack donated to Holy Spirit Catholic Elementary School by request (2014)
- 8 Post & Ring installs for 16 bikes by request on city 'right-of-way' for Saint Brigid Catholic School

TDSB Terms

- 3 year agreement
- TDSB installs, owns and maintains bicycle racks on its property
- TDSB invests ongoing resources in a 'bike to school' program / curriculum
- City of Toronto provides a one-time donation of 300 multi-bike racks (for 8 bicycles each)
