The day was concluded with an interactive prayer service where students from Father Henry Carr and St. Joan of Arc, and members of the CSLIT Executive, explored different ways God communicates with us. The service included drama, student led songs, and visuals.

This was JoyGold's last general assembly and she expressed her gratitude to the CSLIT community for their growth in leadership and in the faith. Student owned small businesses set up booths to promote their company, services, and products.

It was a conference filled with professional development, meaningful workshops and networking between alumnis, incoming and outgoing Student Trustees. They also celebrated the 25th anniversary of OSTA-AECO and were able to reconnect with old friends, share best practices, and common goals.

CSLIT EXECUTIVE TEAM:

Elementary:

Equity:

- Faizat attended Voices that Challenge, gathering important information from fellow students on issues and concerns they recognized. Faizat has given this information to Vianca and Ruben to help create the Pillars of Focus for the following school year.

Charity:

- Directors Ralph and Sofia provided the CSLIT monthly report to the Angel Foundation for Learning
- They continue to be in contact with Joyce Moriana from the Meagan
